



## FEBRUARY 2021 NEW YORK UBE BAR RESULTS

- 1,054 out of 2,130 candidates passed – 49% (40% in February 2020)
- 1,076 of all candidates were unsuccessful – 51% (60% in February 2020)
- 74% of the 1,095 first-time takers from out-of-state ABA accredited law schools passed (70% in 2020)
- 77% of first-time takers from New York ABA accredited law schools passed (74% in February 2020)
- 34% of the 1,035 repeaters were successful (28% in February 2020)
- 43% of all 857 foreign-educated lawyers passed (52% of first-time takers passed)

<p><b>Essay 5 – Real Property</b></p>	<p>Easement by implication and, when servient estate was sold, buyer was not a BFP since the gravel road put buyer on inquiry notice.</p>
<p><b>Essay 6 – Sale of Goods Contract</b></p>	<p>“Signed” merchant memorandum removes oral contract from the Statute of Frauds between merchants, but only as to the quantity set forth in the memo.</p>
